Grand Exalted Ruler John D. Amen has proclaimed November as Veterans Remembrance Month to encourage us to find those veterans of the 22 million living in our communities who need our help.

For Elks, "So long as there are Veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them". Elks are present in every VA hospital. We adopt veterans (<u>www.Elks.org/Vets/AdoptAVeteran.cfm</u>). Elks support families with our Army of Hope. We place POW/MIA tables in Lodges. Elks participate in the National Veterans History Project (www.loc.gov/vets). We happily distribute Comfort Care Kits. We do a great deal for our Veterans. But, more can be done. The Iraq and Afghanistan Wars have generated more than 2 million young veterans. Many have returned home with disabling injuries. More than 18 percent of new Veterans suffer from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, according to a 2008 Rand Corporation study. These young Veterans and all Veterans and their families have sacrificed something for us. In November, let's thank our Veterans and remember them in some special way. It is the least we can do.



Elks 42nd Annual Hoop-Shoot



The Brainerd Elks will be conducting their annual Hoop-Shoot on Saturday, December 13, 2014 at Forestview Middle School. Over 4,000 kids will first compete at their own schools during the month of November and then send their winners to the local Hoop Shoot to compete on Dec. 13th. there will be approximately 100 kids from a 30-mile radius of Brainerd to compete at this level. The winners at the local level will then advance to the

Central District Hoop Shoot on January 24, 2015, which will again be held at Lake Region Christian School in Baxter. From this competition the winners will then advance to the State Hoop Shoot in Hutchinson, MN, the Regional Hoop Shoot in Iowa City, IA, and the National Hoop Shoot in Springfield, Mass.

Of course, along with the local Hoop Shoot there is a huge need for volunteers. We do need 30 volunteers at the local Hoop Shoot on Dec. 13th. The jobs are not strenuous at all. Your assistance will be greatly appreciated. There will be sign-up sheets on the bar at the Elks. It is so much easier on the committee and myself if there is a head-count of those who will volunteer so PLEASE sign your name on the list to volunteer or ask the bar tenders for the list. Social Committee will meet the first Wednesday of November to plan events for the rest of 2014.




