

Secretaries Report—Snow Birds keep your address current


Fall is definitely upon us, I hope it is a long fall and short winter!

Grants Approved

Three grant applications have been forwarded to the Elks National Foundation. Two have been approved. We are awaiting word on a third.

Continuance of the Beacon of Hope grant for \$2,000 is to provide a free dinner to Central Lakes College enrolled veterans and their family once each week from September through mid-May. Weekly hosts are needed to eat and socialize with the veterans and make them welcome. This program has been in place for two years.

Feeding drop-in young adults at The SHOP twice each month is the goal that the Promise Grant has also met with approval from the ENF. Burgers will be offered to these teens twice a month.

We waived, cheered and cried, strangers hugging strangers and the men waved back, their eye's locking on our faces as if to say, 'thank you'. They were home....Were they Hero's? In my mind, Yes!



Brainerd Elks 1st Annual Bob Osborne Memorial Cribbage Tourney


